 - This note taker will appreciate a close review of these bullet points. The discussion was fast-paced and he had a hard time trying to capture it. The minutes are mainly chronological, but where appropriate, relevant comments are placed in relevant areas
 - There will only be a few classes as notated as SCS on a transcript, so there was trouble at the senate meeting, but Shelton explained in reality there are not going to be a lot of classes.
 - The courses as offered are holes in the current curriculum at SCS
 - These classes are now special topics, and have been offered for a while so this suite of classes is mainly to convert them to permanent classes
 - These classes are electives in the SCS program
 - Another issue seems to be that there is no real policy in place to deal with day students taking courses in SCS. Or at least there is an informal understanding that day students

cannot take SCS courses during the fall and spring; but they can take them in the summer.

- O’Connell points out that day students can take an online classes - have to take Bristol online classes.
- HOWEVER: Romano reports that there are successful rules in place now that prevent day students from courses at SCS. The it is the “c” designation.
- Larger question: it seems likes the SCS program and Day program are different enough that the curriculum (and perhaps the schools) should be decoupled or, if not decoupled, the relationship needs to be spelled out.
- Pres of senate joined the meeting to update us concerning the SCS designation.

- It was the understanding of the committee that the petition was returned from the senate for two reasons:
- First issue is designation of SCS this is being taken care of by the Provost and the Senate Executive Committee as the President of the Senate reported who joined the meeting noted
- Second issue is that there is overlap with existing courses, but the committee was informed by the registrar that with a “c” designation (which these classes have) day students can be barred from taking an SCS course, so overlap may not be an issue. When the committee voted on this proposal the first time (in their February meeting) it was this assertion that was the main factor in getting the petition approved.
- **NOTE: The Senate moved to returned this to the FSCC – however, Curricunet automatically returns petitions to the Petitioner. So these two petitions are no longer in our queue. When the Provost has reported back to the Executive Committee, we will request the petition be moved back to the FSCC... or the SCSCC if that is the appropriate move.**

(O'Connell, Warnapala) (5-0-2-3)</p> <p>During the discussion of this motion, there was a vote to call the question that failed (2-4-1-3), so the discussion continued.</p> <p>The notetaker invites the committee to add what they think are relevant points that he missed, but in essence, the the issue is that the faculty in COMM was not notified about this proposal. However the chair of the department was. It was the understanding of the petitioner, based on the most recent meeting, that notification of the chair of the relevant department was sufficient, but it appears as if the chair of the department did not share information about the petition with all the department faculty, perhaps due to a time constraint.</p> <p>Past practice in the FSCC (and the RWU Curriculum Policies) is that the Department/Area Faculty are notified and consulted regarding possible overlap/duplication/impact and evidence of such be included in the petition. The FSCC deviated from that practice with regard to the two SCS petitions voted on 2/10.</p> <p>The resulting resolution to all of this is for the COMM faculty to review and comment on the proposal at their meeting on 3/23.</p> <p>Shelton points out that SCS is not treated the same in the curriculum process as the other programs.
